ONE CAR, ONE TREE PROGRAMME

Introduction

Developing countries rely heavily on wood fuel, the major energy source for cooking and heating. In Africa, the statistics are striking: an estimated 90 percent of the entire continent's population uses fuel wood for cooking. In Kenya, 5.6 million households depend on firewood or their energy use, each household using an average of 10 Kgs of dry wood daily and surprisingly, 10 kgs is the average equivalent of a one tree that is three year old! This scenario describes clearly how deforestation is occurring at a high rate and the need to act fast to avert the scenario.

One Car, One Tree Programme – its broad objective is to restore the lost forest cover and help raise it to the world's recommended cover of 10% and more. The initiative targets to adopt a new approach of tree growing as opposed to tree planting by adopting one tree for every car. It is a joint initiative of Autoterminal Japan Ltd a company dealing with inspection of motor vehicles to and from various parts of the world and Green Africa Foundation –environmental Conservation Organization. Autoterminal Japan donates one dollar for each car inspected to Africa on a monthly basis. Green Africa Foundation educates various communities on the importance of protecting the environment and thereafter distributes tree seedlings to be grown in Schools, homesteads and faith based institutions. The tree seedlings have so far been distributed in lots of 10,000 in a particular area. So far we have distributed two lots.

On 14th Dec 2011, Green Africa Foundation distributed the second lot of 10,000 tree seedlings to residents of Tungutu Sub Location in Kitui County in Kenya, during a public function with the community convened by the area chief Mr Muthinzi Kasilia at Unyaa Primary school. The very successful forum which discussed various development issues including matters on agriculture and environment was attended by about 2,000 people.. The trees have since been successfully planted both in the School Compound, in the pupil's homesteads and the community at large, a situation which the people are happy about.
